- IV. Biblical Pattern of Repentance 2 Corinthians 7:9-11
 - A. Observations of 2 kinds of sorrow
 - 1. Worldly sorrow is the loss or denial of we want for ourselves.
 - 2. Godly sorrow is from God and our cooperating with God.
 - B. Actions and attitudes from Repentance from sin
 - 1. Earnestness or concerted effort to make amends
 - 2. Indignation horror or distress from one actions
 - 3. Fear or alarm for their injurious effects 2 Corinthians 2:1-4
 - 4. Longing and concern for restoration, reconciliation
 - 5. Zeal or strong desire for change
 - 6. Readiness to see justice done, More than willing to accept the consequences
